On November 18, 2023 Deputies conducted a traffic stop in the Medaryville area. This led to the arrest of Wyatt Hagerman for a misdemeanor driving offense, and felony possession of controlled substances. Canine Tiko assisted in the search of the vehicle.

On November 18, 2023 Deputies conducted a traffic stop on State Road 39 and County Road 750 North. This led to the arrest of Michelle Rector and Roy Wireman for felony possession of controlled substance. Canine Tiko assisted in the search of the vehicle.

On November 19, 2023 Deputies conducted a traffic stop in the Medaryville area. This led to Michael Mcilvain being arrested for misdemeanor possession of controlled substances.

On November 22, 2023 Deputies were called to a man stumbling in the roadway in the area of County Road 200 South and County Road 225 East. This led to the arrest of Brendan Mcglone for Public Intoxication.

On November 22, 2023 Deputies were called to the Denham area for a peacekeeping detail. While on scene, Mark Fritz exited the residence with a firearm. Mark was arrested for felony Intimidation with a Deadly Weapon.

On November 24, 2023 Deputies conducted a traffic stop in the Monterey area. This led to the arrest of Billy Kilgore for Felon in Possession of a Firearm. K9 Tiko assisted in a search of this vehicle.

Deputies with the Sheriff's Office logged 128 calls for service. Of these calls 42 of them were traffic stops. During the week deputies responded to death investigations, a house fire resulting in a death, a medical call of a firearm blowing up at the shooting range, various domestic disputes, personal injury crashes, property damage only crashes, fraud reports, warrant services, and mental health crisis calls.

Pulaski County Corrections is overseeing the care and custody of 106 inmates. They have also assisted with cleaning out the basement of the Justice Center in preparation of new construction projects taking place in the courthouse.
